#### **A note from Father Perry:**

**This Wednesday the Church celebrates The Feast of the Epiphany.** This feast commemorates the 'manifestation' of Jesus as the Christ – or, in other words, how Jesus reveals himself to the world. Several stories from the Gospels are traditionally read either on or around Epiphany: the Visitation of the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12); the Baptism of Jesus (Luke 3:15-16, 21-22); and Jesus turning water into wine at the wedding feast of Cana (John 2:1-11). Each in its own way manifests Jesus as the One chosen by God to reveal God in the world (by birth, by baptism, by ministry). We will be celebrating the Feast of the Epiphany at the weekly Wednesday service of Holy Eucharist and healing on January 6 at 7 p.m. Since this is the first Wednesday service in 2016 we will be adding a candle-lighting ceremony to our worship at which time people may reflect on the healing we need in our lives and how we might draw strength from God's healing love to renew us and restore us as we begin the New Year. **We hope you will join us at 7 p.m. this Wednesday, January 6!**

### **About Epiphany**

On January 6<sup>th</sup> the Church celebrates the Feast of the Epiphany, which marks the end of the 12 days of Christmas each year. Epiphany is a Greek word meaning “manifestation” or “appearing.” At the Feast of The Epiphany we celebrate Jesus being made manifest or appearing as Christ. Traditionally, there are three manifestations celebrated on this feast day. The most widely celebrated manifestation, and the one that has been historically celebrated by Christian churches in the West, is Jesus revealed as Christ to the three wise men, or Magi, from the East, who followed the Star of Bethlehem at Jesus’ birth. Twelfth Night, the eve of the Epiphany, ends the Christmas season, and is a night for celebration, feasts, and presents.
