The <u>Advent wreath</u> is a popular Advent custom that originated in Germany. It consists of four candles, surrounded by evergreen branches. The light of the candles signifies the light of Christ, who will come into the world at <u>Christmas</u>. Hope, Peace, Joy and the fourth candle of Advent is the candle of love. Its light is meant to remind us of the love God has for us.



#### From Fr. Perry's sermon:
