Reflections from Father Perry:

Sunday's Gospel reading recalls the miracle Jesus performs at a wedding feast in Cana (John 2:1-11). I encourage you to read this Scripture for yourselves, keeping in mind the following:

- Note the abundance of the water becoming wine 6 jars of 30 gallons each. That's 180 gallons! Remember Jesus performs this miracle to reveal the nature of God. The extravagance of the miracle mirrors God's extravagant blessings that we receive.
- Not everyone was aware of the miracle. How many miracles happen in our lives without our recognizing them as God's blessings upon us?
- Ordinary water becomes extraordinary wine! God has a way of taking ordinary people like you and me and making us extraordinary! Do we fully grasp this and accept this as true in our lives?
