



St. Peter's, the 6th oldest parish in the Episcopal Church in CT will hold our annual meeting following one combined worship service at 9a.m. We will begin with a parish potluck brunch, and we encourage folks to **bring side dishes to share**. The Annual Report will provide a look back at 2023 and I will recap it in my sermon which is my annual report to the parish. In addition, we will meet to share our hopes for 2024. With the coming of our 200th anniversary of our church building in October 2026, we will give an update on work being done to ready the building for its 3rd century of service in the Hebron community.
