

Acts 10:34-43

Peter began to speak to Cornelius and the other Gentiles: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ-- he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

Happening Soon
Day of Tears: Sunday, April 12 at 3:00p.m.

In January, in honor of MLK holiday, we had scheduled the Day of Tears performance. However, due to extreme winter conditions, we had to move the date of the performance to April 12. The play provides an opportunity to witness and reflect on a tragic day in American history. On March 2nd and 3rd, 1859, the largest auction of slaves in American history took place in Savannah, Georgia. More than 400 slaves were sold. On the first day of the auction, the skies darkened and torrential rain began falling. The rain continued throughout the two days, stopping only when the auction had ended. The simultaneity of the rainstorm with the auction led to these two days being called “the weeping time.”

Master storyteller, Julius Lester has taken this footnote of history and created the crowning achievement of his literary career, the day when more than 400 men, women, and children were sold at the largest auction of enslaved people in the United States. We’ll gather at St. Peter’s Church in Hebron to hear powerful staged readings of the voices of those men, women and children. A discussion with the actors will follow the performance to then be followed by supper in the parish hall. We encourage you to read the book prior to the event, but if you don’t the program will stand on its own. Registration is strongly recommended.
